WORSHIP

Sunday mornings at 8:00 and 10:30am and on Monday evenings at 7:00pm; mid-week services during Lent and Advent at 7:00pm on Wednesday evenings.

SUNDAY BIBLE SCHOOL

Each Sunday at 9:15am we offer the basic truths of God’s holy Word for children from 4 years old to those in 8th grade.

BIBLE CLASSES

Weekly Bible classes meet on Sunday and Wednesday mornings and periodically throughout the year at other times during the week. Several times a year Bible Information Classes are offered to present the basics of Bible truths for those who are new to our faith and those interested in learning more about the Savior.

SUMMERTIME GROWTH

During the summer we offer Bible study for young children to help them grow in the knowledge and love of God’s Son, Jesus Christ, through our Vacation Bible School



CONFIRMATION CLASSES

These classes are for youth in seventh and eighth grade. For those in our Lutheran elementary school, time is taken during the school day for the classes. For children in the public schools classes are held on Wednesday evenings at 6:30pm. Using the Small Catechism of Dr. Martin Luther as their guide, students explore God’s Word (law and gospel), getting to know God better and learning what it means to be his disciple.

TEENS’ BIBLE STUDY

Sunday mornings from 9:15 to 10:15 in the Youth Ministry House. Topics of study are geared to the interests of the teens.

LUTHERAN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

A full scope of education in the light of Christ is offered to children from pre-kindergarten through 8th grade.

MISSION SOCIETY



"Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation."
(Mark 16:18)

This is what the Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS), the Rock River LWMS Circuit and St. Matthew's Mission Society are all about. For over forty years women from over 900 congregations in the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) have joined together to "increase interest in and support the mission endeavors" of the WELS.

The year of 2004 was a busy one providing many opportunities to learn, be inspired, and support mission work over and beyond our normal personal and congregational involvement. The national convention held in Sioux Falls, South Dakota had a registered attendance of 1482 (including several from St. Matthew's: delegate, alternate and others), with an estimated 1600+ at the opening worship service. There were 15 missionary presentations, Bible studies and workshops all giving so much inspiring information, in addition to the worship services and devotion sessions. What a wealth of information in three days!

The Rock River Circuit provided two opportunities to learn about Project Timothy in the Dominican Republic and the R.O.C. in Watertown (Recreation and Outreach Center) which serves almost 100 young people in the seventh to twelfth grade age group in the Watertown area.

Here at St. Matthew's we held six meetings which covered study topics in our mission fields from Communist China, Puerto Rico, Central Africa Medical Mission, Mission to the Mormons, Mission to the Children (Mexico), Malawi (Pastor John Janosek served there for 40 years), to Brazil. In addition there were many "home" missions, here in the United States, also studied.

As we look forward to 2005, we realize the many opportunities that again await us. The national LWMS convention (#42) will be held in Minneapolis (Bloomington), Minnesota on June 23-26: "All Seasons With Jesus". (The 2006 convention will be a farther drive to Seattle, Washington.) There will also be two opportunities to attend circuit meetings in our area.

Here at St. Matthew's we will again be holding meetings on the 2nd Tuesday of the month at 1:30pm. In addition to our regular study meetings we will continue with our various on-

monthly newsletter and other materials, gather and disburse the mission box offerings, assist with cards to visitors, to name just a few.

We invite all ladies of St. Matthew's to participate in any or all of the activities of the Mission Society. The congregational LWMS membership makes all of us "members". Participation is encouraged – at meetings (local, circuit and national), through your gifts (mission boxes and others), through personal study of materials made available, and most especially with your prayers. Let us all share the Gospel of Jesus our Savior! ST. MATTHEW'S MEMORIAL LIBRARY

The purpose of this committee is to provide administration and guidance for the purchase, maintenance, display and loaning of books and other audio/visual materials to adults, teenagers, children and guests of St. Matthew's congregation which will promote Christian living and foster Christian growth. Items are acquired through donations or purchased with funds from gifts and memorials of congregational members.

All items are available for checkout whenever the church is open and circulated on an honor system. Directions for checkout are listed in the library with a drop slot for returned items.

St. Matthew's Memorial Library has over 1200 items available for checkout. This includes 1074 books, 130 videos and 13 CD's. Cassette tapes of each week's church service for the past year are also available for checkout. There were 210 items checked out in 2004, an average of about 18 items per month. The library committee has recently added three DVD's and will likely be adding more in the coming year. The committee has recently complete entering library data into a computer program and, after doing an inventory, plans to have a complete card catalog available to help you find items by looking up a title, author or subject heading. Please use the resources in your church library to help you keep your focus on Jesus in all you do.

The Library Committee is also responsible for making large print copies of hymns and the liturgy for Sunday/Monday services. Committee members occasionally address day school classes of the upper grades regarding use of the Library.

We continue to be members of WELS-CLO, our synod's organization of church libraries with meetings offered twice yearly.

Committee members meet as a group for work sessions and business meetings throughout the year and work individually on assigned tasks as needed. Contact the president, Nancy Jones, for more information.

CHURCH CHOIR

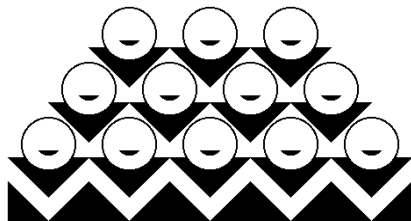
The Church Choir provides members with the opportunity to raise their voices in song and make music unto the Lord of our salvation.

THE SHEPHERD'S STAFF

The Shepherd's Staff provides assistance to people experiencing special needs in their lives, helping members of our congregation, but occasionally seeing opportunities in the community to give evidence of Christian love and concern. The Visitation Committee tries to maintain a congregational presence with the shut-in members of our congregation through home visits made by volunteers. The Home

Care Committee provides help for those who need short-term assistance with various tasks in the home. Our third area of interest is the Shepherd's Staff's "FOCUS Ministry". "FOCUS" is an acronym for: Friends Offering Christ-centered Understanding and Support. The goals of the FOCUS Ministry are to: assist church members and their families in the affirmation of their faith when they encounter the crossroads of change in their lives, to walk along with those individuals, providing emotional and spiritual support during those periods of loss, crisis or change. The FOCUS Ministry works closely with the other committees because individuals may need support in more than one area at the same time. 1) The Worship Services Transportation Committee's goal is to provide transportation to worship services on a regular basis to members or prospective members of St. Matthew's who are unable to drive. 2) If you'd like to know more about the Shepherd's Staff, or could use the help of the Shepherd's Staff, contact one of the pastors or one of the people listed under the Shepherd's Staff in the Directory pages at the beginning of this Annual Report.



The Shepherd's Staff correspondent, as part of the FOCUS Ministry, sends notes of encouragement to members of our church and informs them of the services the Shepherd's Staff provides.

In 2004, the Shepherd's Staff made 216 visits to our shut-in members, provided 12 meals to 7 family units, sponsored 2 congregational meals, served 2 luncheons for our senior members (1 coordinated with the ACTS youth group), hosted a Shepherd's Staff volunteer luncheon, provided 25 rides to worship services, made 10 FOCUS Ministry visits helping 3 individuals/families in difficult situations, and sent over 90 cards and notes to more than 55 members in need of encouragement.



STAFF MINISTER

Dennis Fletcher has been serving as a staff minister at St. Matthew's on a volunteer basis during the past year, while he completes his studies at Martin Luther College. Dennis has been assigned responsibility for the Sunday Bible School program, assists in visits to church members and to outreach prospects, and helped in VBS. He also helps with chapel services for the Lutheran Elementary School and whatever and when ever the Pastors need additional help.

This past year 853 hours (March 1-December 31, 2004) were spread out in the following manner:

A.C.T.S. YOUTH GROUP

ACTS (Active Christian Teens Sing, Serve, Socialize)

The mission of the St. Matthew's Youth Ministry is to assist parents in keeping their teens in God's Word and equipping them with the skills and encouragement to live God-pleasing lives through: Bible study, worship service, fellowship, outreach.



ACTS accomplishes this mission in a multitude of exciting ways. We have weekly topical Bible studies, short devotions before activities, write a worship service from start to end and lead that service here at St. Matthew's and at our mission Hope Lutheran. We do community service projects like helping families with special needs children, or helping the free clinic to name a few. We serve God in our home church by running and helping with several church functions. Fellowship is achieved with social activities offered in a wide array of entertainment from open gyms. To water parks, to online WELS chats, to attending regional and international WELS youth rallies. We reach out with God's Good News when we work with WELS Kingdom Workers, run our own VBS, plan and execute TEEN reach out activities and more.

All teens 8th-12th grade are automatically made aware of all ACTS activities via mail, calling lists, announcements.
