

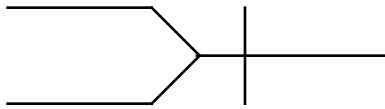

Lesson 3 - Compound Subjects and Predicates

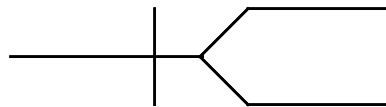

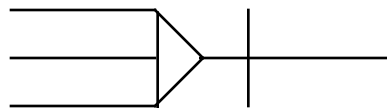
1. Where are the puzzles and games? (4)
