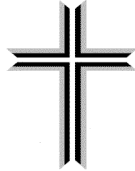

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

He was delivered over to death for our sins. -- Romans 4:25

A good place to begin Lent is with the old African-American spiritual (*Christian Worship*, #140). "*Were You There? Were you there when they crucified my Lord?*"

Notice the little pronoun in the verse from Romans above – "*our* sins." It doesn't take too much effort to see the sin involved in Christ's death. We're quick to pick up on the hatred and the hypocrisy of the Jewish leaders. We easily identify Pilate's lack of courage and his unwillingness to stand up for justice. We think of Judas' greed that led to the Savior's betrayal, and Peter's pride that led to his denial. We see how fear put the wings of flight on the disciple's feet that night in the garden.

But "*our* sins!." That can be another matter. What we so easily see in others can remain unseen

in ourselves. Paul sets the record straight with that pronoun "*our*." So must we if our Lenten observance is to benefit us. My shortcomings, which no amount of paint can gild no matter how thick I apply it; my unloving attitude, which has its way of picking at those around me; my sinful pride, which can criticize and complain about almost anyone and anything – all this and more were part of the Calvary equation. Soldiers swung the hammer, but my sins pierced him. Hell claimed him and chained him in its torments that Good Friday, but my sins forged some of the links.

Were you there when they crucified my Lord? "Yes," each of us must answer sadly. The hymn writer has it right. "*Sin was there on Calvary, all the sins of ev'ryone, laid upon God's sinless-Lamb, there on Calvary.*"

But notice something else in Paul's words. **God** was there on Calvary. He "*delivered*" Jesus "*over to death for our sins.*" No, God didn't not cause the cross; human sin did that. But God used the cross to cancel the debt for all

those sins. There on Calvary God's justice and God's love came together to deal with our sin.

Again the hymn writer has it right: "*Love was there on Calvary, streaming from the heart of God, reaching out for ev'ryone, there on Calvary.*"

There when they crucified my Lord? Thank God our happy answer can be, "Yes," there, seeing and believing what God's love has done with all our sins.

Congregation Mission Offerings Increased in 2006

Congregations followed through on their 2006 Congregation Mission Offering commitments and submitted more than the projected amount for the calendar year. The amount, \$20.2 million, was a four percent increase from the \$19.5 million given to the synod last year.

The increase keeps receipts ahead of the U.S. rate of inflation, which is 3.5 percent. In order for WELS to maintain current ministries, however, offerings need to grow by five to six percent each year.

“I cannot find enough ways to say, ‘Well done, good and faithful servants,’” said WELS Director of Christian Giving Pastor Dave Liggett. “I’m confident that as we strive to ‘excel in the grace of giving’ we will see our giving rate remain above the rate of inflation and, with God’s help, increase to the point where current ministry can be expanded.” Churches are currently submitting their commitments for 2007.

Congregation Mission Offerings is a portion of member offerings committed each year by WELS congregations for synod-level ministries. It is the primary source of synod support, making up 62 percent of total revenue. Other sources include gifts from

individuals (8%), foundation grants (24%), and bequests (5%) besides other (1%). All sources fund the 2006-07 fiscal year budget of \$32.7 million. Nearly 75 percent of the WELS budget goes to support missions and ministerial education, while the remainder goes toward such things as parish services, mission advancement, and administration.

More information about the synod’s budget and the gospel ministry being carried out through your offerings can be found in the WELS 2006 Annual Report.

Our 2006 Annual Report (page 25) gives a picture of the contributions of our congregation’s Mission Offerings sent to the Synod.

LIBRARY CORNER

During this season of Lent, our thoughts are again on Jesus' suffering, death and crucifixion. Our library has materials that can help

us learn and meditate on these events that happened almost 2000 years ago. "Persons of the Passion" describes some of the personalities surrounding Jesus--persons who were there as Jesus was arrested, crucified, and arose again. "The Crucial Hours" tells the Biblical story of the suffering and crucifixion and where possible refers to secular history to help understand the events and customs of that day. In " All the Holy Days and Holidays" we are given short, informative, devotions for Lent, Palm Sunday, Good Friday, and Easter, while "Miracle of Time" has longer messages on Christ, the Cross, and the Resurrection.

Max Lucado a popular author of religious books has written two moving books on the subject of Christ's suffering. "No Wonder they call him the Savior" is about events surrounding the Crucifixion whereas "And the Angels were Silent" covers the entire week before the crucifixion. Finally we have a DVD of "The Passion of Christ" by Mel Gibson, a very stirring movie.

We hope these materials will help you better understand the events surrounding Jesus' crucifixion and get ready for the joyous Easter message.

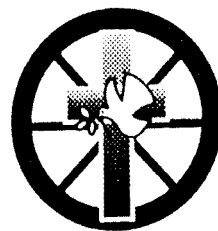


SHEPHERD'S STAFF NEWSLETTER

ELECTRONIC BULLETIN BOARDS & ORDER OF SERVICE

Members of our congregation have asked that we put the order of service on the screen to make it easier for them to keep up with the service, while trying to keep children settled. We need to have several steps occur before we can put this into practice.

First we needed a pc to run the system so that we do not need to

always have someone with a laptop. That first step was completed when our member, Scott Surges donated the necessary equipment. Thank you Scott for your help. That pc has been installed and is ready for use. The second part is for a dedicated staff willing to take crucial responsibility for running both the electronic bulletin board before services, the WELS connection, once a month, and the order of service. We are looking for volunteers. We have four volunteers from the ACTS group, but need quite a few more to lighten the load.

It is not that difficult to do, however, some basic knowledge of computers is necessary. Training will be given. Much more important is the willingness to familiarize yourself with the order of service and be able to keep the slides displayed when they are appropriate in the service. Jesus Cares Ministries accepts vehicle donations

The most common statement that I hear as WELS/ELS members donate their used vehicles is this; "I didn't know there was a WELS ministry that accepted vehicle donations. I have always donated to Rawhide in the past." This year about \$15,000 was received for

donated vehicle sales. This amount will increase as more people hear about this program. Just one vehicle donation per week would bring an average of \$25,000 per year in additional funds to preach the Good News of Jesus to people with developmentally disabled.

Main reasons people donate:

- 5) They have a vehicle they no longer have a use for and want to support a WELS ministry.
- 2) They don't want to have to pay for advertising to list their used car for sale.
- 3) They don't want to have to set appointments to meet potential buyers to sell their vehicle.
- 4) They get tired of potential buyers telling them how bad of shape their car is in.
- 5) They have donated vehicles in the past and like the convenience.

How do you make a donation?

- 5) Your car needs to be in running and drivable condition, we do not have the resources to accept non-running or non-drivable vehicles.
- 2) Have a clean title to the vehicle and the title is in your name, or your spouse's name.
- 3) Call Heidi at 414-259-0292 and set a time to donate your vehicle, metro Milwaukee area can drop vehicle

by appointment at our office located in the school building behind Gloria Dei Lutheran Church at 94th and Capital Drive. Outside metro Milwaukee can be picked up by scheduled appointment, usually within a week to ten days.

- 4) We supply the paperwork to facilitate the donation and charitable deduction that you maybe entitled to.
- 5) Clean and washed vehicles tend to bring higher resale values which increase your deduction.
